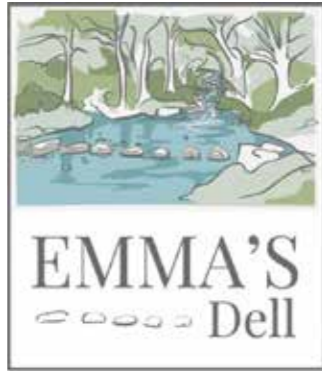


DRINKS MENU

WHITE WINES

1. Sauvignon Blanc - Pato Torrente

Well-balanced and smooth, with fresh fruit and attractive tropical fruit aromas and flavours, this is a refreshing wine for every occasion. *(Chile)*

2. Verdejo - Fontana Mesta (Organic)

Located at altitude in Uclés Northern Castile these certified organic vineyards produce wines of real complexity. Intense notes of cut grass and white flowers develop into a crisp refreshing wine with excellent balance and minerality. *(Spain)*

3. Chardonnay - CJ Pask

Cool fermentation retains the pristine varietal flavours while partial barrel fermentation and five months ageing on less imparts complexity, texture and weight to this generous wine. A pale, honeyed colour with aromas of ripe melon, peach, tart, honey and a hint of oak. The wine gently coats the mouth with its medium-body weight. Grapefruit pithiness adds texture, with the finish lingering on a delicious ginger and white pepper note. *(New Zealand)*

ROSÉ WINES

8. Tempranillo Rose - Fontana Mesta (Organic)

Grown in the Northern Castile region of Uclés this high-altitude vineyard produces certified organic wines of real softness and depth. Pale strawberry in colour with intense red berry aromas and subtle floral notes the excellent concentration of fruit is balanced by crisp acidity and an elegant off-dry finish. *(Spain)*

RED WINES

4. Merlot - Pato Torrente

Bursting with ripe, dark berry fruits and coffee bean flavours, this is an elegant, medium bodied all-rounder, delicious with red meat dishes and cheese. *(Chile)*

5. Pinot Noir - Paparuda

With fresh aromas of strawberry, raspberry and caramel on the nose, this extremely drinkable, light-bodied Pinot has bags of succulent red berry fruit on the palate, all wrapped up with lashings of toasted oak on the finish. *(Romania)*

6. Malbec - Sol de Mayo

This medium-bodied red from the famed Mendoza wine region is intensely red in colour. Flavours of black cherry and plum fruits and fine tannins pave the way to a smooth and spice-filled finish. *(Argentina)*

7. Tiamo Prosecco

Clean and fruity on the nose, this lively, fully sparkling wine is full of citrus and stone fruit on the palate, making it perfect for an aperitif or an occasion. *(Italy)*

Emma's Dell is the name which William Wordsworth gave to
a special place close to this café in Easedale.
He and his sister, Dorothy, stumbled upon the spot shortly after moving to
Dove Cottage in Grasmere. Emma was a
pseudonym which Wordsworth used for Dorothy.
He wrote the following poem about Emma's Dell:

It was an April morning: fresh and clear
The Rivulet, delighting in its strength,
Ran with a young man's speed; and yet the voice
Of waters which the winter had supplied
Was softened down into a vernal tone.
The spirit of enjoyment and desire,
And hopes and wishes, from all living things
Went circling, like a multitude of sounds.
The budding groves seemed eager to urge on
The steps of June; as if their various hues
Were only hindrances that stood between
Them and their object: but, meanwhile, prevailed
Such an entire contentment in the air
That every naked ash, and tardy tree
Yet leafless, showed as if the countenance
With which it looked on this delightful day
Were native to the summer.- Up the brook
I roamed in the confusion of my heart,
Alive to all things and forgetting all.
At length I to a sudden turning came
In this continuous glen, where down a rock
The Stream, so ardent in its course before,
Sent forth such sallies of glad sound, that all
Which I till then had heard, appeared the voice

Of common pleasure: beast and bird, the lamb,
The shepherd's dog, the linnet and the thrush
Vied with this waterfall, and made a song,
Which, while I listened, seemed like the wild growth
Or like some natural produce of the air,
That could not cease to be.
Green leaves were here;
But 'twas the foliage of the rocks--the birch,
The yew, the holly, and the bright green thorn,
With hanging islands of resplendent furze:
And, on a summit, distant a short space,
By any who should look beyond the dell,
A single mountain-cottage might be seen.
I gazed and gazed, and to myself I said,
'Our thoughts at least are ours; and this wild nook,
My EMMA, I will dedicate to thee.'
-Soon did the spot become my other home,
My dwelling, and my out-of-doors abode.
And, of the Shepherds who have seen me there,
To whom I sometimes in our idle talk
Have told this fancy, two or three, perhaps,
Years after we are gone and in our graves,
When they have cause to speak of this wild place,
May call it by the name of EMMA'S DELL.
